

BURBERRY – COVID-19 SECURE RISK ASSESSMENT

Internal Reference HS170-13 v2.8

Burberry's priority is ensuring appropriate measures are in place to provide a safe and healthy environment for employees, customers and visitors attending Burberry's premises. This risk assessment refers to the health and safety organisation and arrangements for all global Burberry managed locations in response to Covid-19 and, where applicable, aligns with WHO and local Government guidance.

Key information:

Background – Various national governments are easing COVID-19 restrictions and whilst we welcome the additional freedom this brings; it is crucial that we continue to protect the safety and wellbeing of our colleagues. With this in mind, Burberry will keep some Covid-19 safety measures in place until further notice.

Scope: This risk assessment applies globally for all Burberry operated locations, including corporate offices, Internal Manufacturing, Distribution and Retail locations and covers the minimum standards required. In some locations, dependant on the risk profile, there may be additional control measures implemented or an adaptation to the requirements of the host location or landlord (i.e., Concessions, Mall or Outlet stores).
